Re: Gas Networks Ireland – Application to the Commission for Regulation of Utilities pursuant to the provisions of Section 39A of the Gas Act 1976 (as amended) for consent to construct the Newtown Pipeline (Gas to LCC Power, Kilshane Energy Project) (“Newtown Pipeline”)

Ms. Trant,

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 39A of the Gas Act, 1976, as amended, and following receipt of a certificate of bona fides issued by the Commission for Regulation of Utilities (“CRU”) on 28 February 2025, Gas Networks Ireland hereby applies to CRU for consent to construct the Newtown Pipeline.

LCC Group Limited (LCC Group) has requested a gas pipeline connection to their power station site in Kilshane, Finglas, Dublin 11 where they are currently constructing a reserve power generation plant. LCC Group has requested a 32.8barg gas supply and [provided] a load estimate of 857MWth.

The project involves the construction of the new 300mm diameter welded steel gas pipeline. The design pressure of the Newtown Pipeline is 85barg and the length is 715m. An Above Ground Installation will be required on the Kilshane power station site to reduce the pressure to 32.8barg, suitable for end user requirements.

We enclose our application for consent to construct the Newtown Pipeline and look forward to hearing from you at your convenience.
